Commitment to developing a health system that...

Works closely with other sectors and service users to...

- Address the complex health needs (inc. mental health and substance use needs) of people experiencing homelessness
- Ensure everyone has access to required and appropriate healthcare
- Support prevention of premature ageing, mortality, illness and disability
- Strengthen integrated care pathways with shift from a hospital to community led model
- Provide best-practice, person-orientated and evidence-based services



HSE National Social Inclusion Model of Care

Model of care for the health of people experiencing homelessness in Ireland

Underlying principles:

- Intersectoral policy, research and service delivery
- Integrated and person-orientated care
- Service-user involvement in service planning and development

Commitment and buy in from senior management

Care coordination: Continuity of care through dedicated workers and teams

- Share care and case management approach (homeless and addiction services)
- Integrated assessment and care planning
- Enhancement of integrated homeless teams
- Partnerships (i.e. mental health/palliative care)
- Key work/case management





Long term sustainable housing solutions

- Stronger partnerships with Department of Housing and Local Authorities
- Identification of and support for housing requirements based on health needs





Interagency technology solution

- OoCIO (Office of the Chief of Information
 Office) support with identifying interim and
 long term integrated technology system/s
- Pilot through hospital discharge project
- Joined up approach with addiction services





Homeless Hospital Discharge protocol (standardised)

- Development and pilot implementation of protocol through hospital discharge project
- Supported through governance structure
- Review of protocol and identification of gaps and blocks (pilot evaluation)



Training and education

- Competency Framework
- National training programmes
- Training partnerships
- Intercultural Health Training
- Peer involvement and service user experiences
- Hospital discharge training

National Projects



Service Reform Fund (SRF) – Homelessness Initiative

- Integrated approach by the Department of Housing, Planning, and Local Government, Local Authorities, the Department of Health and the HSE, in line with the Rebuilding Ireland
- Aims to address complex housing and health needs, including mental health and addiction needs,
 of people experiencing homelessness and improve their access to appropriate healthcare through
 enhancing housing first tenancies and strengthening integrated care pathways.

Housing First Initiatives

1.
Support 100 additional housing-first tenancies in Cork, Limerick and Galway (and Waterford TBC) (including wrap around health supports for Housing First participants)

2. Review of health supports for Housing First initiative in **Dublin**

Integration and enhancement of existing Dublin Housing First

Homeless Hospital Discharge & Integrated Pathways

- 3. Inter-agency homeless hospital discharge pilot-project:
- Pilot implementation of a Dublin Homeless Hospital Discharge Protocol with view to Nation-wide adaptation
- Enhancement of shared assessment and care planning

Homelessness Actions

1. Integrated Care Pathways and Joint Ways of Working

- Homeless hospital discharge pilot project
- Enhance integrated homeless action/case management teams
- Joint assessment & care planning processes
- Competency framework for homeless & addiction services
- Step-up/Step-down facility in Dublin

2. Housing First

- Actions in line with National Implementation of Housing First
- Enhancement of wrap-around health supports and integrated pathways
- Development of Health Monitoring Framework
- Training and evaluation

3. Enhance Mental Health and Addiction Supports

- Enhance services within homeless accommodation & provide in-reach speciality mental health and addiction supports
- Prioritise homeless actions as outlined in the National Drug Strategy
- MH stepped model of care project

4. Enhance Inreach Primary Care and Outreach Services

- Improve primary care services by enhancing services within homeless accommodation & by providing in-reach speciality primary care services
- Increase the capacity of the mobile health clinic, to provide outreach services for hard to reach homeless people with complex needs
