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# Overview

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## Homeless Concentration in North Inner City

National homeless figures = 10,172

Dublin 1 homeless figure = 1,488

**(4% of area population = 20 times national average)**

Dublin 7 homeless figure = 785

**Therefore 22.3% of the people who are homeless nationally are accommodated currently within the 2 Community Health Care networks in the North Inner City.**

## MPT concentration in North Inner City

Nationally there are approximately 10,316 people within the Methadone treatment programme

2933 persons in MMT reside in our CHO 9 (28.4%), with nearly 1,000 people living in the NEIC area

# Our focus

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- Is the continued expansion of community based care services ensuring full interagency approach to support people experiencing homelessness and addiction

# Developments

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1. Opening of the Inclusion Health Hub -April
2. Development of an Addiction Services Case Management Team – Supported by NEIC
3. Development of a Homeless Persons Case Management Team – Supported by NEIC
4. Implementation of the Common Assessment process

# Development of Inclusion Health Hub

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Full multidisciplinary team supporting broad range of vulnerable service users in the North Inner City, this includes the development of:

- HSE Health Link Team,
- Specialised GP and Nursing practice, (Safetynet Primary Care)
- Homeless/Addiction Case Management Team

Improved health outcomes for the most vulnerable in society including those with addiction issues, the homeless, refugees, asylum seekers and Traveller and Roma Communities

# Additional client focused service improvements

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- Implementation of community based Hep C treatment initiative.
- Enhance the post natal supports to women attending the DOVE clinic in the Rotunda Hospital
- Expansion of community based care services to ensure an inter-agency approach to minimise the harms from misuse of substances and to promote rehabilitation and recovery
- Rollout of Support Ask Assess Offer Refer training programme within the community and to expand to include identified acute hospital staff in CHO DNCC area.
- Development and delivery of Naloxone training and distribution to target a reduction in drug related death and non-fatal overdoses Ref NDS action 2.2.30b within CHO DNCC.
- Expansion of the HSE partnership with the Change for Life Programme.

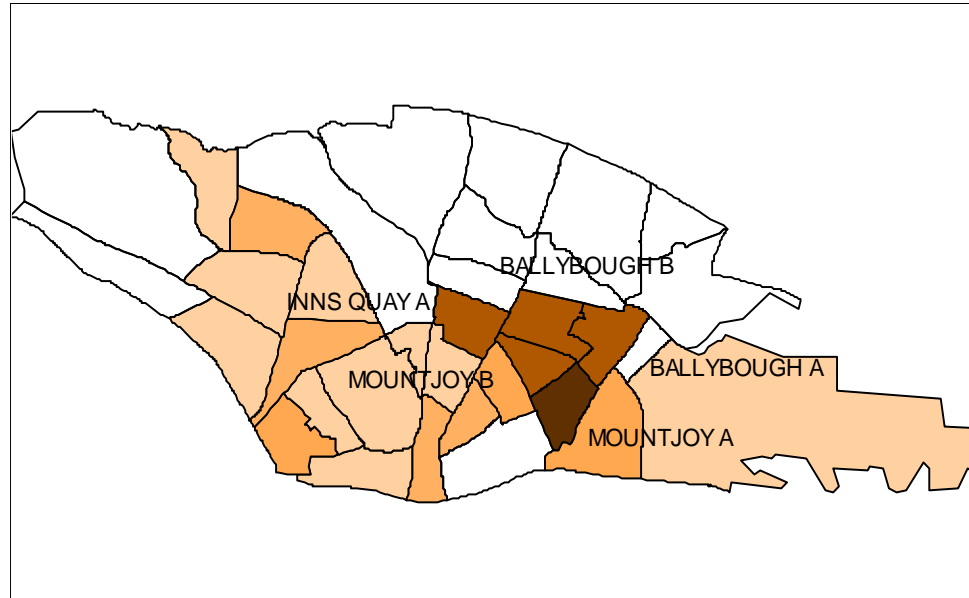
